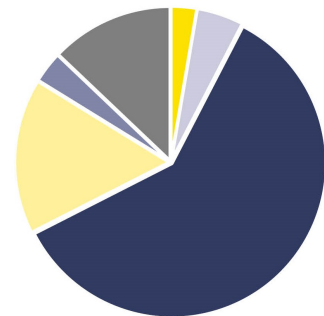

● Workforce Development	16.3%
● Aftercare	3.3%
● Fundraising	2.7%
● Administration	12.9%
● Permanent Housing	4.9%

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

HOUSING

Transitional living for homeless veterans in a therapeutic community, permanent supportive placement, guided housing search, referrals for move-in fees and utility assistance, furniture and other household goods

COUNSELING

Individual therapy, psychoeducational groups, substance use treatment, telehealth support groups, referrals to community providers, outpatient counseling services (coming soon!)

CASE MANAGEMENT

Individualized case plans with veteran's self-identified goals, collaborative relationship with case managers in gaining housing, employment, increasing income, overall stabilization via on-site support, community referrals

OUTREACH

Clothing, emergency shelter, food

AFTERCARE

6-month post-discharge case management program with resources & referrals to: educational information, meal planning, tenant responsibilities, public transportation, mental health/substance use support, and financial management

CAREER SERVICES

Career center, job interview skills, job search assistance, clothing, supportive employment needs, paid job training

LIFE SKILLS GROUPS

Anxiety management, aftercare class, anger management, coping skills, patient education, job club, on-site activities with staff and volunteer groups and more!
