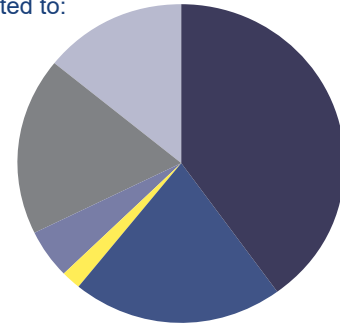

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

**CAREER DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE (CDI)**  
Employment referrals, career coaching, resume building, and interview preparation.

**WOMEN VETS ON POINT (WVOP)**  
Provides women veterans with tools and information, peer support, direct mental health services, access to housing and employment, and connection via phone, chat or email.

**OUTSIDE THE WIRE (OTW)**  
Provides individual and group counseling and case management to student veterans and their families on community college campuses in Los Angeles and Orange Counties.

**VET2PEER PROGRAM**  
A collaboration between U.S.VETS and Loyola Marymount University that trains veterans to become certified Peer Support Specialists and supports them in job placement and career counseling.

**AFTERCARE**  
Case management support for veterans to ensure stability in permanent housing with referrals to resources, such as educational information, transportation, mental health, financial management, and more

**ADDITIONAL SERVICES OFFERED**  
Patriotic Hall offers collaborative and coordinated services through a network of agencies focused on the needs of veterans and their families – all under one roof. Our individualized services include everything from legal advocacy to help with VA benefits to connection with housing and SSVF programs.
