Transitional, emergency and permanent housing; move-in and utility assistance; housing search; furniture and household goods assistance

COUNSELING

Individual, family and group; mental health and substance abuse treatment; post-traumatic stress disorder; cognitive-based therapy and anger management

CASE MANAGEMENT

Individualized case plans, goals, advocacy, benefits assistance, legal services and recreational activities

SUPPORTIVE SERVICES FOR VETERAN FAMILIES

Financial assistance, rent payments, eviction prevention services, general household items assistance, utility payments, car repairs and rapid re-housing

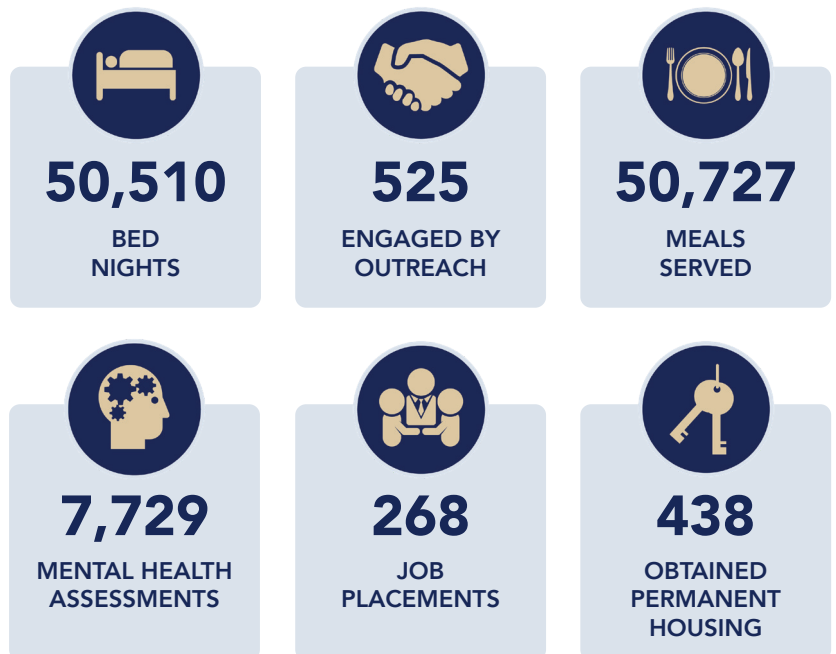
CAREER SERVICES

OUTREACH

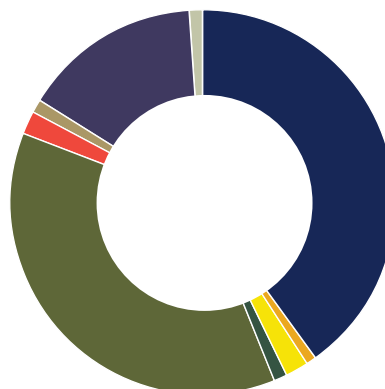
Clothing, emergency shelter, food and referrals to other services
