HOUSING

Transitional, emergency and permanent supportive housing; move-in and utility assistance; housing search; and furniture and household goods

COUNSELING

Individual, family and group; mental health and substance abuse treatment; post-traumatic stress disorder; inner conflict; cognitive behavioral therapy and anger management

CASE MANAGEMENT

Individualized case plans, goals, advocacy, benefits assistance, legal services and recreational activities

OUTREACH

Clothing, emergency shelter and food

SUPPORTIVE SERVICES FOR VETERAN FAMILIES

Financial assistance, rent payments, eviction prevention services, general household items assistance, utility payments, car repairs and rapid re-housing

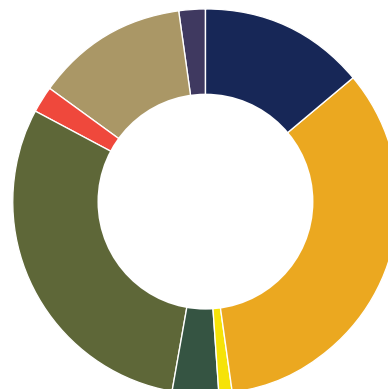
